**Scripture Reading for the Weekend  
of January 16 & 17**

**John 2:1-11**

**Summary**

John the Elder writes to a local church leader and her "children" (that is, the local house church), encouraging them to continue to walk in the truth and love of God. He warns them to avoid false teachers or "deceivers" who deny that Jesus Christ has come fully in the flesh.

**So What?**

This letter reminds readers that theology matters to our "walk in the truth," our daily lives in faith. Especially important to any Christian's life is one's view of Jesus Christ.

**Who Wrote It?**

The "elder" who wrote this letter is often identified as John, the same person who probably wrote the Gospel of John (maybe in cooperation with other writers). This elder may or may not be the Apostle John, son of Zebedee.

## **Pandemic Preparedness What You Can Do!**

As the potential for upswing in the H1N1, these months of winter and after holiday crowds, The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) both have developed basic guidelines for individuals and families:

- Stay healthy. Take care of yourself: Eat healthy foods. Exercise. Get enough sleep.
- Get vaccinated for the seasonal flu, and if available and you fit the CDC guidelines, get vaccinated for H1N1.
- When coughing and sneezing, cough into your elbow or use a tissue and cover your mouth.
- Wash your hands frequently or use hand sanitizer.
- If you do get sick, stay home from work or school to limit spreading the virus.

Because so many people are getting sick, prepare in the following ways:

- Know your work and/or school emergency plans.
- Know how your office, worksite, or school will get information to you.
- Talk to your employer and know their plan.
- If possible, plan that you work from home if needed.

The more we prepare for the H1N1 pandemic, the more we can lessen its impact. Just like public health agencies, we all should hope for the best, but be prepared for the worst.

### January 10 - *“Service and Witness in China—A Miraculous Opportunity”*

Presenters: Paul and Ida Martinson

Paul and Ida will speak about their life in mission. Paul was born in China of missionary parents. He graduated from St. Olaf College, Luther Seminary and University of Chicago Divinity School. He taught at Luther Seminary as Professor of Christian Mission and World Religions. His wife, Ida, is an RN. They recently traveled to Hong Kong and are active in the Midwest China Study Resource Center.

**Social Justice Book Club**

**Tuesday, January 26, at 6:30 p.m.**

The group is reading *The Shame of the Nation* by Jonathan Kozol, which discusses an important issue in the U.S. - our education system. We know that test scores vary widely from district to district - how can we do better? Mr. Kozol has visited approximately 60 schools in 30 different districts, in 11 states. His glimpses inside America's second-class schools tell the story that numbers can't, with voices of students and educators many of us would never hear. This book is available at the Nativity Book Store.
