


Deborah

Judges 4:1-16



Deborah was a powerful and heroic leader who was called by God. She served as a judge, settling disputes among the people while sitting under a palm tree. When the Israelites were threatened, Deborah convinced the reluctant Barak to face the opposition. By bravely facing this battle, Deborah helped to defeat the army that had been oppressing the Hebrew people.

Here are some of the people and things in today's story. What can your child tell you about them?



Deborah was a heroic leader who was called by God to lead the Israelites during the time before King David united the 12 tribes.

Barak was a military leader who refused to go to war unless Deborah came with him.



Sisera's army had 900 iron chariots—more resources than the Israelite army.

Try This!


Practice the role of judge together. Watch or read a news story. How would you settle the dispute? How do you think God would call you to settle it?

The 5 Finger Prayer

Thumb: Those closest to you, your family.

Ring: (weakest) Those that are weak, in trouble, or in pain. We cannot pray too much for them.
