#### SCENE ONE: GROWING IN WISDOM

"But why did you need to search?" Jesus asked. "You should have known that I would be in my Father's house."

## SCENE TWO: BAPTISM

He was known as John the Baptizer, because he called people to immerse themselves in the Jordan River after they confessed their wrongdoings.
