

Nativity Welcomes Jeanne Cotter. New Director of Music

Jeanne has a fascinating call story. Most of us know Jeanne as Nativity's pianist. Now she is something more! Jeanne was raised in Austin, Minnesota, the second oldest of ten children. Her mother began giving piano lessons when each child reached the age of five. Her mother was the music leader at their Catholic church, and by the fourth grade, Jeanne was her weekly accompanist: "Mom put single melody lines in front of me and asked me to 'make up' an accompaniment. I had no idea what I was doing but quickly learned the art of improvisation. She was a tough teacher, but her total confidence in me has shaped the trajectory of my career."

Jeanne has been involved in liturgical music her entire

career. She has served in churches, composed, recorded and published music for worship, and created her own record label. She is a published author, singer-songwriter and storyteller. Much of Jeanne's vocation has been on

When asked if she ever felt a call from God to her vocation, Jeanne replied, "At the heart of everything I do is the prayer I spoke when I was just seven years old. I remember sneaking into the church during recess at my Catholic school, sitting on the altar steps and asking God to 'please, please, please teach me how to love'. I believe love is the greatest calling and gift to share in ministry. If anyone at Nativity feels 'seen,' appreciated, loved by me, then I am living my call story! Making music together is the 'icing on the cake'."

When asked how she feels about being a part of Nativity, she replied that she has felt welcomed and is particularly moved by our statement that all are welcome no matter where they are on their spiritual journey. "I'm thankful," Jeanne says, "that Nativity is open to receiving the gifts I offer. I feel very blessed to be a part of this community."
